College athletes did exceptionally well at the KZN Athletics championship this weekend winning 2 Gold, 2 Silver, and 4 Bronze medals!

Individual highlights include:

W Pretorius placed 2nd (Silver) in the U15 300m hurdles J de Valence took Gold in the U15 Shot Putt, and finished 3rd with a Bronze medal in the U15 Discus K Hadebe finished 3rd in the U17 100m hurdles and 3rd in the 400m hurdles, winning two Bronze medals.
