

### **Weekly Sport Round-Up**

Highlights this week were the winter fixtures held at home against Glenwood in the main.

The dominant fixtures this past week was the Saturday spread against Glenwood, in the main, played at College. College enjoyed the lion-share of the results on the day in winning 20 of the 24 rugby matches and winning all 11 of the hockey matches against Glenwood. The 1<sup>st</sup> XI Hockey continued their good form from the previous week in winning 4-1. The stand-out performance of the day was definitely the U16A rugby team who, after being 0-21 down, came back to win 35-21. A very gutsy performance that exemplified true College spirit. It was pleasing to see how many of the age-group rugby and hockey teams recorded very positive wins. This is testament to the effort from the boys and coaches all the way down the teams. The 1<sup>st</sup> XV game was broadcast on SuperSport and Glenwood took the spoils on the day (12-37). There were filler fixtures in both rugby and hockey, and we also played games against Howick, Alex and PMB Development. Some of these schools really tested some of our lowers teams, and it is encouraging to see our local schools so competitive within their own rights. These relationships with peer schools in the area is really important to our programmes. Other fixtures this past week saw our Esports boys in action again, winning 1 and losing 2. On Sunday, the Cycling club opened the Winter season with the XCO series and a number of our top riders finished in strong positions on the day.



Rugby 1<sup>st</sup> XV Match Report (1<sup>st</sup> XV Coach: Tim Orchard)

Goldstones welcomed a much vaunted Glenwood side on the weekend in a televised Premier InterSchools match. The Maritzburg College team were coming off a good win over their local rivals St Charles and felt that if they stuck to their guns they could overturn a Glenwood team who were short of match experience.

The first fifteen minutes proved to be an exhibition of College doggedness on defence in the face of wave after wave of Glenwood attack. Eventually a chink in the armour emerged and Glenwood snuck through with a fortuitous try under the uprights which was duly converted. From the resulting kick-off Glenwood made a rare mistake gifting College an attacking opportunity. Maritzburg College number eight and Captain Nthuthuko Mchunu picked up off the base of the scrum and attempted one of his barnstorming runs which he has become notorious for, but the resulting pass was a scrappy one with Jacques Van der Walt picking the loose pass of his bootlaces before a powerful handoff placed him in a pocket of space which he exploited manfully. The resulting conversion was unsuccessful with College chasing the game at 7-5 down with fifteen minutes to play. The resulting kick-off was poorly received gifting Glenwood vital field possession and a scrum infringement allowed Glenwood to increase the lead to 10-5 after the penalty was calmly slotted over. The lead was further increased to eight points when sustained Glenwood pressure led to College being adjudged to having committed a breakdown infringement and the resulting penalty being kicked over. The skies darkened further for Maritzburg College when Glenwood managed to find some space in midfield with the ball being quickly recycled and passed out to the right wing where the try was duly scored. Halftime score was 20-5, with Glenwood looking to further stretch their lead and Maritzburg College equally determined to get back into the game through any means necessary.

The second half started off with a flourish, and Glenwood exhibited a display of serious skill and speed resulting in two tries being scored in relatively quick succession, which put College firmly on the back foot as their defensive frailties out wide were clinically exploited by a rampant Glenwood attack. This represented the nadir for a College team bereft of ideas on how to stop a Glenwood team who was full to the brim with ball player's intent, showcasing their skills at every occasion. Some rare sustained possession and pressure from College eventually was transformed into points as a Glenwood scrum was turned over allowing Philalani Simamane to canter over the tryline bringing some rare joy to the College supporters in attendance. The try was duly converted by Keegan Collyer to put the score at 30-12.

With the game drawing to a close, College attempted to run the ball from their own try line which gifted Glenwood an easy seven point try when the ball was sloppily turned over right on the College try line. This put the score at 37-12 and the referee brought an end to proceedings..
