

Weekly Sport Round-Up

Term 2: 16-19 May 2018

Highlights this week were College's comprehensive performance across a range of sporting codes, including excellent results in cross country, soccer, table tennis, and in the hockey and rugby sporting fixtures against DHS and other schools, held from 16-19 May.

College's #RedBlackWhite teams continue to produce excellent results in the Midlands Cross Country league; and are now leading the league dominating in both senior and junior divisions.

No other school can meet College across all our hockey and rugby teams, and as a result, we had fixtures against a range of schools this week.

Our RedArmy hockey teams played against Weston, Carter, King Edward High school (KEHS), and 6 games against DHS. Of these latter fixtures, College won 5 of the 6 games, and 9 of the 11 total fixtures. It was also a week when the KZN Inland hockey teams were announced with College making up an outstanding 43% of the teams including 22 A Team places and 18 B Team places.

On the rugby front, College won 9 of their 11 games against DHS, and 16 of the 21 total games played, losing 4 and drawing 1.

College's squash teams won all three of their games this week, against Epworth and Michaelhouse, and there were also good results for the table tennis teams winning 8 of their 12 games, along with excellent chess and shooting results.



1st XV Rugby Report

On Saturday, Durban High School played host to a much anticipated clash between Maritzburg College and DHS. The match between the two schools is always a popular fixture on the KwaZulu-Natal Schools sporting calendar. Saturday's match brought together two sides who have had very different seasons so far but due to the intense rivalry between the schools, it is a match that is a great leveller.

The match started well for College as they quickly assumed a six-point lead via the boot of Jacques van der Walt, as numerous ruck infringements were put away by the College flyhalf. DHS hit back with a well worked try via an impressive blindside play that caught the College side napping; the try was duly converted putting the score at 7-6 to DHS. College refused to lie down as they upped the physicality of the game in the hope of grabbing the match by the scruff of the neck. This was not to be as a further two defensive errors gifted DHS two scoring opportunities which they did not hesitate to capitalise on putting the score at 19-6 with just a handful of minutes remaining in the first half. College hit back with another well taken penalty by Jacques van der Walt putting the score at 19-9. Maritzburg College began to assert some dominance on the match as a series of bruising runs by their forwards allowed them to gain line success, which was eventually converted into points when College fullback Matthew Williamse crossed the whitewash with a much needed try. The try was converted by Jacques van der Walt and the referee brought an end to the half with College having their tails up but still three points behind their opposition at 19-16.

The second half started very well for DHS as their x factor players came to the party with Celimpilo Gumede, the DHS skipper and number eight, crashing over the tryline with a fine try which was not converted. College were now scrambling, but a wonderfully executed backline move allowed Nkondlo Radebe to punch through the DHS defensive line, giving College a marvellous attacking opportunity deep in the DHS half. Some slick interplay between the College backs found Matthew Willemse in space who with a kick through, found Philalane Simamane, who barged over to collect a great try, which was duly converted by the College flyhalf. This put the score at 24-23. DHS hit back again with their left winger finding some space and sprinting through to score in the left hand corner. With the try converted College looked dead and buried with the scoreline at 31-23. Further salt was rubbed into College's wounds, with a lineout try putting DHS further ahead and looking very comfortable with a 15-point lead after the try was converted, and the score at 38-23. College now had a monumental task ahead of them if they wanted to win the match; they managed to score with loosehead prop Ethan Hodgson barging over with a much needed try, and once this was converted, College began to believe a comeback was on the cards at 38-30. Unfortunately, this was not to be, as a poorly executed kick chase allowed the elusive DHS backs a rare opportunity to display their devastating counter attacking skills, and put paid to any hopes that College may have had. The kick was converted with DHS deserved winners on the day, and a final score of 45-30.

This time the penalty corner resulted in a penalty stroke when the ball caught a DHS player on the line preventing the ball from crossing the line. Cameron Hollaway was charged with the duties and calmly converted from the spot.

College continued dominating the exchange with wave after wave of attack, as the DHS goal keeper put on a great display.
