



Weekly Sport Round-Up Term 1 – 2-4 March 2018

As the last curtain falls on the first half of the 2018 Summer season, College is looking back at a very solid week's performance in the sporting arena.

Most of the school fixtures were against Glenwood. College has enjoyed many a tough encounter with the Umbilo giants of recent years. Stand-out results were the cricket scores, where College won all 19 of the games! Whilst the statistic is one to be proud of, it is of course important to recognise and acknowledge the boys who diligently train week in and week out to produce such positive performances, as well as the coaches and parents who have supported them. The 1st XI continued their dominance with a clinical 6 wicket win, and has impressed this year so far.

With only a few basketball games against Glenwood, College walking away with all 5 wins on the day. A number of filler fixtures were played against Treverton, Carter and Scottsville, and College enjoyed positive results with a number of wins against higher opposition teams.

Our Golfers deserve a special mention and continued their dominant show of form ending the 1^{st} term unbeaten with convincing wins by both the 1^{st} and 2^{nd} teams against St Charles and Michaelhouse.

On the Waterpolo front, results were mixed against Glenwood with the 14A and 16A recording confident wins on the day. Maritzburg College end season with an impressive win against Glenwood

College 1st XI finished off an excellent first half of the season with an impressive 6 wicket win at Glenwood. Losing the toss and being asked to bowl first was exactly what College wanted and were absolutely clinical in the bowling department with Hollaway and Khumalo leading from the onset, and striking early as usual, reducing Glenwood to 2 for 1 run after 3 overs. Glenwood were never allowed to get going and were found wanting at 20 for 4 in the 13th over, which escalated to 30 for 7 in the 19th over. After drinks, Glenwood came out "guns blazing" and played some attacking cricket by going over the top to anything full, and were eventually bowled out for 74. The bowlers were exceptional, bowling in tandem, and never allowing partnerships to develop.

College got off to a comfortable, but rather slow start, with the outfield being unbelievably slow, and were 23 for 1 after 19 overs. When Glenwood struck twice in one over to reduce College to 31 for 4 after 29 overs, there was some concern in the ranks, especially after Glenwood bowled 7 maidens in a row. However, the cool head of captain Bradford, joined by the expansive hitting of Noble, finished the game off in style with an attitude of "what was the concern, gentlemen!"
