

Weekly Sport Round-Up

Term 2: 16 June 2018

Overview of events

Highlights this week were our canoeing results at the SA Marathon Championships in St Francis as well as the last round of hockey and rugby fixtures of the term against respected rivals Glenwood, played at Glenwood.

College's hockey teams provided a spectacular set of results winning all 10 of their games against Glenwood and only conceding 2 goals in all the matches played! The top team results were especially rewarding with the 3rd team final score at 6-0, the 2nd XI winning 10-0 and our 1st X1 recording an excellent 5-1 victory. A further 3 games were played against St Charles College and showed similar results with College winning all three convincingly.

College fielded 19 rugby teams against Glenwood this weekend winning 13 of the encounters and losing 6. It was in the top teams where Glenwood showed their superior skills winning the U15A, U16A. 2nd and 1st team encounters.

Congratulations to Maritzburg College's Mondli Khumalo who has been selected to represent the SAU19 cricket team on the upcoming tour to England from 29 June until 30 July 2018, where the team will play a 2-day warm up match, followed by 2 x 4-day Test matches and finally three x ODI matches.

The 2018 South African Canoe Marathon Championships took place in the unique canal course in windy conditions in St Francis Bay last week. With four places for men and women on the national team up for grabs, two each in the Under 18 and Under 23 age divisions, competition was fierce. In the Junior boys race, College's David Evans finished 11 seconds behind Uli Hart in 1:41:10 to claim the second K1 spot for the Junior U18 SA team to go to the World Championship in Portugal in September.

College's soccer A side played the College B side in the quarter final of the KZN Futsal Tournament, with College A winning 2 - 0. Unfortunately, our A team lost the semi-final to SuperSport Utd. Maritzburg College travelled down to Durban take on Glenwood High in a return fixture. Glenwood hadn't played much rugby in the lead up to the fixture which showed in the opening stanza of the match. In the first twenty minutes of the match College more than held their own against a much vaunted Glenwood team but simply could not convert all their position into points as basic errors started into creep in. Glenwood in the last ten minutes of the game showed why they are in the top five teams in the country. They punished a wasteful College team with an excellent display of clinical finishing scoring four tries in the space of ten minutes. The second half followed a similar pattern to the first, College enjoying plenty of possession and territory but could not make it count where it matters. 1st XI Hockey Report vs Glenwood Dylan Coombes (Director of Hockey & 1st XI coach)

This weekend saw the return fixture against Glenwood having gone head to head earlier on this term. College triumphed 4-1 in the previous fixture and College were looking to bounce back from a disappointing outing a week ago.

Glenwood came out with nothing to lose and proved to be a handful for the drilled College outfit. With many chances being created by College in the opening stanza they were putting Glenwood under pressure but couldn't open their account. It took until the 21st minute for College to break the dead lock through captain Russel Stainbank. College won themselves a penalty corner and with Mpumulelo Maphumulo setting Stainbank up perfectly, he fired into the net to open scoring on the day. The first half concluded with numerous chances from College however unable to improve the scoreboard albeit through dominant play.

The 2nd half got underway and College seemed to ramp things up a bit looking more and more dangerous as time went on. 11 minutes into the 2nd half and Maphumulo again found himself in the mix when he fired a clinical backhand pass into the circle finding Greg Will who deflected home brilliantly. Just a minute later and College would extend their lead once again from a perfectly executed penalty corner. Stainbank and Andre Bradford would combine beautifully to see Bradford deflect into the net from the penalty spot to score College's third of the day. The match ebbed and flowed for a patch thereafter until Glenwood won themselves a penalty corner which they executed perfectly. The ball was pushed to the top of the circle where it was flicked perfectly into the bottom left hand corner to open Glenwood's account on the day.

Four minutes from the end and a quick counterattack from College saw them move the ball swiftly upfield before once again finding Greg Will in space with much work to do. A good receive and quick finish saw him bag his second and College's fourth on the day. College were not yet done when in the last minute of the game some creative play upfront saw Sicelo Ngcobo in the perfect position to finish simply and take the College tally to 5.

Proceedings concluded with College 5-1 victors on the day with a balanced performance. College go into the holiday period with provincial tournaments to look forward to before their final 3 matches of the season next term.
