Weekly Sport Round-Up 27-28 October 2018

Maritzburg College - winning performances from our teams against local rivals Treverton and Westville

From Friday last week, College teams played cricket, water polo, and basketball matches against local schools including Westville and Treverton. Our boys also competed in local canoe events.

Cricket

College's cricket fixtures started on Friday with our 1st XI playing against a HUB side in a T20 match at home. College opened the batted scoring 148 for 2 in their 20 overs; Klusener making 53 not out and Heuer 48 not out. The HUB side replied with a score of 129 for 8, with excellent bowling from College's Elam 3/23, Mbatha 2/22 and Khumalo 2/24, giving College the win by 19 runs

On Saturday, most of the cricket matches were against our coastal rivals Westville in a combination of 20, 30 and 50 over games. The 1st XI had a very good win beating Westville by 6 wickets on our home ground. Overall results showed College winning 10 of their 15 matches, losing 4 and the U14A side ending with a very exciting tie.

1st team report (Dave Pryke- 1st team coach)

Maritzburg College convincingly beat Westville by 6 wickets

College 1st XI showed tremendous patience to beat Westville comfortably on Goldstones. This was the last game for the matrices and an emotional day for them and their families. College lost the toss on a sticky wicket and were put in the field. Not a bat toss to lose. College bowled well, but let several chances going a begging. Gengan, Khumalo and Fortmann bowled good areas, ably assisted by Dyer and Bradford. Westville lost wickets consistently and stuttered to 178 for 9 in their allotted 50 overs.

College started patiently to be 34 without loss after 10 overs, but lost both openers in quick succession shortly after the power-play. Bradford and van der Walt rebuilt patiently and the run rate increased from 3.7 to nearing 6 when Dyer strolled to the increase. His energy and running between wickets with van der Walt was exceptional as usual and they took the game through to its conclusion with 3 overs to spare. An impressive win against a strong side who had had the better of the spoils in the first encounter earlier in the year.

1st team report - Basketball report on the match against Westville

College hosted Westville for the return match against Westville Boys' on Saturday. Both schools fielded their Stayers' team and College was determined to record a win having lost in the first term.

The excessive heat certainly was going to be a factor for both sides and as College had played Carter on Friday they would have to dig deep in order to secure a victory. The home team won the jump ball but Westville put the first points on the board from a penalty shot. The 1st quarter was a rather dull affair as both sides struggled to find any sort of rhythm but College did end the quarter with a slender lead of 3 points (15 – 12). It was in the 2nd period that College raced ahead with Zaneliswa Khoza and Liam Janse van Rensberg each sinking a 3-point shot which seemed to give the team the momentum they needed. During this quarter College outscored Westville 16 points to 7. As seems to be the trend with the College side, they lost the urgency to forge ahead and allowed Westville to come within 4 points of their score. Although both teams played an exciting fast paced style of basketball, the Alan Paton Hall was devoid of the usual vocal spectators and this had an effect on the home side who have become accustomed to their supporters spurring them on to victory. The game concluded with College securing a 64 – 55 victory much to the relief of the coaching staff. Liam Janse van Rensberg top scored for College by contributing 21 points to the total. All-in-all it was a successful day of basketball with College only losing one game against the visiting school.
