Although the weather forced a reduction in overs, Maritzburg College 1st XI Cricket side had a great home win against Hilton.

The Maritzburg College 1st XI went toe to toe with Hilton College on Saturday. After persistent rain throughout the morning and the ground staff having to work extremely hard to get a very wet outfield into a playable condition, the game started at 11:15 and became a 40 over fixture. Hilton won the toss and elected to bat and College struck early through opener Sanele Mbatha (2/36). Hilton managed to put together some partnerships through sensible batting but the College bowlers kept things very tight and didn't let the game get away from them. Hilton only managed 39 overs before the rain came again forcing an early lunch. Hilton finished their innings on 182/5 after 39 overs with Michael Booth 53* and Nick Hatton 46.

College, needing 183 off 39 overs, got off to a terrible start losing opener Todd by way of a run out. College captain, Jacques van der Walt fell shortly afterwards leaving College in a bit of trouble at 17/2. Mondli Khumalo was next to go, having to retire hurt after taking a delivery to the hand leaving College effectively 33/3. College were then in all sorts of trouble when opener Tristan Elam fell with the total on 51 after 13 overs. Still needing 132 for victory, Dean Dyer (67) and Ross Klusener (61) put on a superb 114 run partnership to get College within touching distance of victory. Needing less than a run a ball for the last 3 overs, it became tighter and tighter and a couple run outs made the game extremely interesting. College did manage to get over the line with one ball to spare, ending what was an enthralling contest and a game which was a great advert for schoolboy cricket.

Maritzburg College vs Hilton @ College

College hosted their second game of the season against Hilton College and made sure that from the get go that they were not going to be the underdogs.

College won the jump ball and also were the first to opening the scoring. This scoring frenzy from the host school continued for most of the first quarter. Thapelo Mthombeni was outstanding during this period of play and scored three 3-point shots in quick succession. This quarter ended with College 16 points ahead of Hilton (20 -4). Sadly, the quarter was also marred by a serious injury to one of the Hilton players who could not compete further in the match. The second quarter continued to be a fast paced attacking game with Hilton and were unable to halt the goal scoring opportunities created by College. The whistle ended the half with College leading 35 – 10 at the break.

After a team talk by their newly appointed coach Ayanda Shange, Hilton came out to begin the second half with greater confidence and their defence slowed down the offense press by College. However, College still managed to outscore Hilton by 16 points to 8. A greater confidence was seen in the young Hilton side in the final period with the teams matching one another point for point. It is during this quarter that Hilton pipped College by one point (8 - 7). It was however, an overall victory for the host school and a much needed one too with the final score of 58-26.

There were two outstanding aspects to the game; Thapelo Mthombeni's four 3-point shots (top scorer too) and the College supporters who shouted loud encouragement to the team from the first whistle until the final one. They not only supported the team but provided entertainment for the crowd as well. The College supporters were delighted with the victory over their rivals from up the hill. This was a confidence boost for the side before the much anticipated night game against St Charles. It was a very successful day for College basketball with the host school winning 10 of the 11 games played on Saturday.
