Basketball 1st team report against St Charles

Epic PMB basketball derby goes to Maritzburg College by JONATHAN COOK

IT was billed as the derby to end all derbies and so it proved, although one surmises there will be many more such epics if history teaches us anything.

One of the most unforgettable sports contests ended 42-41 to Maritzburg College over St Charles College at Saints Friday night. The newly named Samke Khumalo Arena had set the stage and the first team players didn't disappoint in a match that see-sawed along with the capacity crowd's emotions.

Internationally accredited umpires Stewart Bradford and Suwi Siwila stood tall in the face of the enormous pressure in keeping the lid on things. Early on, playmakers Scott Trollip (MC) and Chris Serra (SCC) showed with phenomenal skill what lay ahead. Zanelisa Khoza shot an unbelievable three-pointer for Maritzburg College before SCC captain Trent le Roux immediately responded with three points of the same quality. Then another Zanelisa Khoza remarkable three-point shot for Maritzburg College. It was electric on court and off and the agile Maritzburg College captain Philani Simamane was effective in forcing the SCC defenders into damaging errors with his elusive qualities. But the Saints were more accurate in sinking baskets.

An extremely tight match in which no quarter was asked or given, Saints' Nkosi Dlamini and James Laynes then upped the ante to close off a stunning move. At five minutes to halftime it was Saints 20 and Maritzburg College 13. Again and again Maritzburg College left points on the table and one wondered if only their shooting came to the party to match their ability in creating opportunities. At halftime Saints were in command at 26-19 and coaches Zeke Oosthuis (MC) and Darren Holcomb spoke earnestly to their players in the huddle.

As this second half wore on it seemed that Maritzburg College were feeding off the incredible vibe and getting stronger. The match broke wide open when Liam van Rensburg of Maritzburg College made space with unselfish play for a top-class Zanelisa Khoza three-pointer (St Charles 26 Maritzburg College 27). That passage of play after halftime was huge for MC but Trent le Roux thought otherwise to pull a classic three-pointer back amid the hustle and bustle and at the end of the third quarter it was 34-34.

With the fourth and final quarter underway the commitment of the boys remained undiminished. With seven minutes left Saints had edged ahead 36-34 in what was tuning into an absolute classic. The chronology from this points tells a story: 36-36 with 6 minutes 34 secs to go; Saints 38 Maritzburg College 36 with 5 minutes left. A three-pointer from nowhere by Nhlakanipho Phenyane of Maritzburg College left the score Saints 39 and Maritzburg College 40 with three minutes left. Timeouts called by the coaches in the dying minutes came and went and the crowd noise was popping the eardrums stuff. The chronology from there: Saints 41 Maritzburg College 41 with 50 seconds left. Four timeouts occurred in quick succession thereafter with the scored locked 41-41.

With 20 seconds left it was still 41-41 as numerous chances went astray, the tension on and off the court difficult to transcribe into words. But with 2 seconds left on the clock Van Rensburg calm collected his thoughts and sunk the match-winning basket for the 42-41 Maritzburg College victory and was immediately mobbed by players and fans alike at the final bell.

It's a stellar moment for the Red Black and White basketball programme as it's the first time in a number of years of the closest of local derbies that the lads from College Road have come out winners. The whole occasion was a spectacular example of KZN10 schoolboy sport at its best.
