#### **Outstanding Performances from College**

The past weekend saw excellent performances for College's sportsmen from Thursday through the weekend in a range of sporting codes; cricket, basketball, athletics, squash, canoeing and waterpolo.

#### Cricket

#### College's cricketers were on top form this weekend, winning 13 of their 14 matches against Michaelhouse

#### 1<sup>st</sup> team match report (Mr Kyle Nipper – Director of Cricket & 1<sup>st</sup> team coach)

The Maritzburg College 1st XI made the trip up to Michaelhouse on Saturday. After yet another lost toss, College were asked to bowl on a very dry surface that would deteriorate throughout the day. The College bowlers bowled with great control and didn't allow the Michaelhouse batsmen to score freely. At 56/2 at Tea (25 overs), College were on top but a fight back from the Michaelhouse batsmen got them to a reasonable total of 148/9 after their allotted 50 overs. The pick of the College bowlers was Robert Akerman with 4/11.

Maritzburg College's chase got off to a reasonable start but 2 wickets in 2 balls put College under immense pressure at 18/2. Scoring became tough on a wicket that started to keep low and take prodigious turn. A couple of small partnerships looked like getting College into a winning position only to be ended by run outs. College were now in a very tough position at 87/5. Kent Goedeke (32 not out) then joined vice-captain Dean Dyer (45 not out) at the crease and the pair batted with maturity and skill to put on 62 and take Maritzburg College over the line for a well-deserved 5 wicket win.

#### Basketball

Maritzburg College basketball teams took on Michaelhouse with midweek and weekend fixtures. The College teams continued their excellent form winning 13 of their 18 games.

#### 1<sup>st</sup> team report Basketball vs Michaelhouse (Mrs J Orchard, MIC Basketball):

The 1<sup>st</sup> basketball side knew, even before they ran out onto the court, that the encounter would be a tough one. From the U14 age group the MHS team had had the upper hand over most teams in KZN.

The host team raced ahead in the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter as College struggled to acclimatise themselves with the court markings and the backboards. Michaelhouse ended the first period 21 - 11 ahead of College. With the captain Philani Simamane on the court during the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter things seemed to settle down with the captain, despite being ill, controlling and encouraging the team. This was a productive period for the visitors who lead the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter 13 – 9 and went into the half break 6 points behind. The second half saw MHS dominating the game with their number 13 player, Kwanele Khumalo, playing a dominate role in putting points on the board. Liam Janse van Rensburg, from College, in the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter had the crowd on their feet when he loped to the hoop and performed a spectacular dunk. This for the College supporters was the highlight of the game. College faltered in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter only managing to add 2 points to scoreboard and at the final whistle lost the game 31 points to 50 with Liam Janse van Rensburg top scoring for College with 11 points and Kwanele Khumalo being the top scorer for MHS with 27 points.

Eighteen games were played against Michaelhouse with College winning 13 of the matches. The U14 and U15 age groups were particularly successful not losing a match.
