Maritzburg College celebrates 156 years of excellence

This weekend – Saturday, 2 March to be exact – marks the 156th birthday of our school.

It was on this very day in 1863, under a hot March sun, that a lean, fair-haired young Scottish schoolmaster, Mr William Calder, opened the doors to a new high school located in a building in old Longmarket Street. Minutes afterwards, he began giving lessons to 36 boys who are famously referred to in the school's history as "colonial ruffians"; boys who were to be the Foundation Scholars of the then Pietermaritzburg High School.

From these beginnings in a humble carpenter's shop, Maritzburg College has flourished and prospered, and has grown into one of Africa's great educational institutions. A modern school in every sense, the school retains a strong sense of its history and heritage. Our 1360 boys will leave College as young men imbued with a strong sense of independence and individualism – but also of team-spirit and belonging.

The school unashamedly embraces its core values of Commitment, Courage, Honesty, Respect, Integrity and Self-discipline, which all our boys are expected to live out each day. College has evolved considerably over the last few decades, and today offers a multitude of opportunities for all boys to find a niche and be happy. We pride ourselves on being a modern, relevant, multi-racial school that embraces all that is best in South Africa's ever-changing environment, and we believe we have a crucial role to play in nation building. Our Social Awareness Programme, with pupil, staff and parent participation, is actively seeking ways to embrace and manage diversity in the school, and ensur it is embedded in the quality education we offer.

While for some boys and teachers who pass through its doors, College remains a mere school, to so many others (in many cases, now dotted around the world) it remains a source of great pride, a font of lasting friendships, loyalties and memories, an enduring symbol of excellence, and a lifelong inspiration.

At Maritzburg College, we are immensely proud of our shared identity that binds the present to the past beneath a vivid tapestry quilted in Red, Black and White. To so many, this is no mere school. And so we salute our school, Maritzburg College, the oldest boys' school in KZN, on the occasion of its 156th birthday.



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Academic Achievements



Focus on... Dramatic Arts

The 2019 academic year for the Dramatic Arts Department started off on a high note with excellent results produced by the Class of 2018 in the NSC exam. All the academic programmes for Creative and Dramatic Arts are running smoothly with the focus being on the 'page to stage' technique. The boys are enjoying the performance aspect to Drama on all levels. Form 2 and Form 3 have explored Choral Verses and Feasts and Festivals respectively, while Form 4 explored a variety of Cultural Performances. The boys engaged in a well-researched teach back session on the different forms of cultural performances. Form 5 studied Realism and experimented with Stanislavski's Method Acting techniques. They explored the power of portraying three dimensional characters using the various Method Acting techniques as part of their performance assessment. The Form 6s are hard at work preparing items for Theme Programmes which is the requirement their final performance exam scheduled to take place in August.

On the co-curricular front, the Drama department is excited about the launch of College Cues. This society focuses on acting and physical theatre workshops, theatrical production workshops and dance. College Cues was delighted to host the legendary Paul Slabolepszy who took the audience on a poignant journey of his life in the show A Slice of Slab. Our Form 5 and Form 6 boys attended a production of the matric text, *Waiting for Godot*, performed by the Namalandi Creativity company. We look forward to having our boys join Menzi Mkhwane, the director at Namalandi Creativity, for a physical theatre and acting workshop early next term.

The school's major production, Fawlty Towers, will run from April 26 to May I, in the Olivier Cultural Centre and the cast is already in rehearsal. The show which is in three episodes is directed by Mrs Elma Fraser – A Touch of Class; James McFarland, Carl Martin and Mr Brandon Swart – Communication Problems, and Mrs Kamany Thaver – The Kipper and The Corpse.
