Dear Parents and Guardians

From the Headmaster's Desk

Since 2015, I have spoken on a number of occasions around issues of internet and cell phone awareness. A number of staff recently attended an IBSC Conference at PBHS where we had a presentation by Emma Sadleir, a leading legal social media educational expert, on the current state of affairs. As you are aware we have also had our own instances at College which I alluded to at the end of last term. It is appropriate for me to highlight a number of pertinent matters on this topic.

Some of the major concerns at schools include Sexting (the social norm amongst teenagers in all schools is rife), Cyberbulllying (leading to teenage suicides), Online predators – TikTok [music videos], Catfishing (a deceptive activity where a person creates a fake identity on a social network account, usually targeting a specific victim for deception), Fortnite – gaming, Twitter – pornography at its worst, SNAPCHAT, WhatsApp, Instagram and Revenge pornography.

It is very important to manage and protect your privacy through your privacy settings on all your accounts. Delete anything that is inappropriate. Don't joke on social media, and remember that what you are posting can be used against you later when applying for a job. Don't let photos be taken of you at a party, being funny, or breaking the law. Don't be tempted to make comments or criticisms about your school, employer, colleagues or parents. Pupils can be suspended or even expelled, and teachers fired for bringing the school in disrepute.

Remember that children of 14 years and older have full criminal capacity and can be charged, and a child of 13 years and older can be sued.

Delete or untag from anything that is illegal or inappropriate and part of a chain of publication. You need to confront illegal content and disassociate from it. If you don't you are complicit.

We as a school are responsible for our social media (e.g. school Facebook and Instagram) and can be sued or even charged for anything that is inappropriate.

With regard to WhatsApp groups, remember that everybody in the group is responsible for what is said or posted.

Parents - you have the right to look at your child's cell phone. Boarding supervisors at the school are also allowed to check what is on a child's cell phone provided there is reasonable suspicion.

Laws that are applicable to social media abuse include Defamation of Character, Privacy, Hate speech, Crimen Injuria [infringement of dignity], Sextortion, Image- based violence, Intellectual property [school as trademark; digital content].

We as a school will continue to monitor and manage these issues in our school, and we ask that you as parents, please support us in this process.

Congratulation to Mr Nithia Pillay on his appointment as DOE HOD: Accounting, Business Studies, Economics and EMS with immediate effect. We wish him every success in his new role. We thank Mr Marwick who was acting HOD during Term I for his contribution.

Teaching Staff attend IBSC Conference

A group of 12 Maritzburg College staff including the Headmaster, once again attended the annual Southern African International Boys' School Coalition (IBSC) conference hosted by Pretoria Boys' High School. This kind of conference is vital for the staff as professional educators, as it provides many opportunities to engage with other teachers, to share best practice for boys, and to learn from speakers who are experts in their field. The theme of the conference was "The world behind our boys" and a wide range of pertinent topics in education, particularly those pertaining to boys' education were discussed. One of the keynote speakers was Dr Abigail James, who hails from the United States. Dr James is a world-renowned teacher and an expert on gender-based learning; her talks were stimulating and insightful, and provided much food for thought particularly in today's electronic age. Technology was an important theme at the conference, and Ms Emma Sadleir addressed us on the dangers of social media. Ms Sadleir is considered to be South Africa's leading expert on social media law.



There were two breakaway sessions, in which delegates were divided up into smaller groups and were free to attend talks in their area of interest. The conference closed with an address by Ms Rachel Adams who is involved in developing high impact leaders. She has worked in top institutions across the world, including Yale University and Allan Gray Orbis. It was a busy but stimulating few days in which new friendships were forged and many discussions were had around what interests us most, namely teaching boys.

Focus on...Sound & Lighting Club

The Sound and Lighting Society at Maritzburg College is based around the boys learning how to do professional sound and lighting, as well as the art of working in theatre.

The boys in the society are encouraged to take part in the College productions to provide technical support and backstage help. They learn, in the beginning, how to do simple sound setups and lighting setups all the way through to understanding how to use the school's advanced lighting and sound desks.

We currently run an Allen and Heath QU 24 Mixer and Behringer XR18 X Air Digital Mixing sound desks as well as a Strand ML250 lighting desk in the Olivier Cultural Centre. This means that the boys have the opportunity to learn the basics of professional lighting all the way from incandescent lighting to LED.

The boys in the society not only learn a technical understanding of theatre production, but also theatre etiquette and a general understanding of how a theatre runs, as we run all our shows on a professional basis.

In the first term, the club provided sound for the Valentine's Day Concert and New Parents Evening, as well as providing support for the various other events. They have also built a new outdoor system that Can be used for events around the school which is quite powerful so can cater for large events.



Currently, the Sound and Lighting Club are working on providing sound and light for the Fawlty Towers production coming up later in the term.

Sporting Spotlight

Holiday Sport for College

The holiday period was a busy for College with our boys competing across a range of sporting codes around the country including rugby, hockey, golf, athletics and canoe polo.

Rugby

The 1st XV travelled to Kimberly to play Noord Kaap while our 2nd XV, U16A and B squads took part in the Margate Festival. The U15A side competed in the Francois Swart Affies tournament while the U15B team played at the Northwood rugby festival. The U14A and U14B sides participated in the Fichardt Park Festival. Overall results were outstanding with 20 of the 21 matches won, losing just one.

Hockey

Our U14, U16A and Open XI hockey teams took part in the Nomads festivals. The U14 team travelled to Wynberg, while the U16A were based at KES and the 1st XI travelled to Pretoria Boys High school. Our U16B squad competed in the Jeppe Festival. Overall College teams played 20 matches, winning 12 and losing 8.

Athletics

Three of our top Athletes took part in the SA School Championship. N Mosebi made the final of the 200m Boys U15 and placed 5th. His semi-final time of 22.79 was faster than the current U15 and U16 school records. The three boys also took part in the Boys U17 4x100m relay and placed 6th overall. N Makanya took part in long jump and N Ndlovu in the 100m and 200m.

Golf

Our golfers took part in the Affies Tournament, finishing in 2^{nd} place. They faced Affies in a matchplay which they won 4-2 and were awarded first place for the tournament.

Congratulations to S Paxton who won the Bridge Fund Managers Junior Series 2019 tournament at Germiston Golf Club with a round that included two eagles.

Canoe Polo

Five Maritzburg College boys made up the KZN U21 Canoe polo team that took part on the SA Canoe polo championships over the holiday.
