Athletics

Three of our top Athletes took part in the SA School Championship from 21-23 March - Neo Mosebi, Ndabazinhle Ndlovu and Ntsikelelo Makanya. Neo Mosebi made the final of the 200m Boys U15 and placed 5th. His semi-final time of 22.79 was faster than the current U15 and U16 school records. The three boys also took part in the Boys U17 4x100m relay and placed 6th overall. Ntsikelelo Makanya took part in long jump and Ndabazinhle Ndlovu in the 100m and 200m but unfortunately did not make finals.

Golf

Our golfers took part in the Affies Tournament from 26 - 29 March, and played some excellent golf rounds over the event, finishing in 2^{nd} place. They then faced Affies host team in a matchplay to decide on the winner. Maritzburg College won the matchplay with a score of 4-2 and were awarded first place for the tournament.

Congratulations to 17 year old Maritzburg College pupil Sean Paxton who won the Bridge Fund Managers Junior Series 2019 tournament at Germiston Golf Club on Sunday 17 March, with a round that included two eagles. Sean believes the key to his low scoring round was his accuracy off the tee and a hot putter. The BridgeJuniorSeries launched in July 2017 with 16 tournaments countrywide featuring Under-13 and Under-19 divisions for boys and girls.
