Focus on... Careers

At Maritzburg College, we believe in preparing our boys for life as well as developing each boy's unique potential. We already have a successful career guidance programme in place in our Pupil Development Centre and Life Orientation departments, but we believe that the recent Career Focus evening enhances this further. When young people focus on their future, there is an improved level of motivation and work ethic at school, and they are able to make informed choices about their careers and subject choices. This event was compulsory for our form 3 and form 5 boys.

In 2017, we held the first College Career Focus evening and the feedback was positive. This year, our third year, we once again identified a number of individuals who we believed would make a valuable contribution to our programme and who are in careers that would interest our boys. These individuals covered a very wide range of careers from the traditional to the more unusual. There were representatives in fields ranging from medicine, biotechnology and veterinary health through to engineering, hospitality, real estate, flying and forestry. There was something to interest everyone!

Our boys and their parents were able to engage on a personal level with representatives from various careers, and in this way, gained first-hand knowledge of what the career is all about. In some cases, opportunities were available for work-experience particularly for our senior boys. There were also a number of gap-year options on offer, both locally and overseas. We are once again indebted to our community for their willingness to be part of an event such as this.

Before you post it online, use the SPACE to THINK approach.

SPACE – Take these steps:

S – Stop: Type it, but don't post it.

P – Pause: Wait for at least an hour, preferably sleep on it.

A – Assess: THINK about what you've typed (see questions below)

C – Confirm: Check with someone else to see what they THINK.

E – Execute: If it passed the test click "send". Otherwise delete it.

THINK – Ask yourself these questions: T: Is it true? H: Is it hurtful? I: Is it illegal? N: Is it necessary? K: Is it kind?

Being a little more thoughtful and circumspect about your social media presence will improve the experience for everyone. Think like a publisher – because in this brave new world, that's exactly what we've all become.

RIP: Robert Douglas Sharrock



12 April 1953 – 20 May 2019

> It is with sadness that we report on the passing of OC Professor Rob Sharrock, a member of the School of Law in Pietermaritzburg for 34 years, who passed away on 20 May after a long illness. Rob was a leading academic in various areas of commercial law. particularly the Law of Contract, and will be

remembered as a brilliant lecturer by thousands of students who passed through his classes.

Rob grew up in Pietermaritzburg, where he attended Maritzburg College, finishing school in 1970 as a prefect and captain of swimming. He was a provincial representative in both swimming and water polo. Rob studied BCom and LLB at the University of Natal in Pietermaritzburg, graduating LLB cum laude in 1978.

After 4 years of legal practice (including completing his articles) at the Maritzburg law firm of Mason Buchan, he joined the School of Law at the University in November 1982. Rob leaves his wife Lienne, son Richard and daughter Mandy and their spouses Caryn and Anton, and grandchildren Dayna and Katie. Sincere condolences to his family and friends.
