Overview Sporting Achievements

This weekend saw Maritzburg College play DHS at home in hockey and rugby fixtures with the #RedBlackWhite teams dominating and winning most of the encounters including both first team games.



Rugby

The weekend saw College play 15 rugby matches against DHS with some excellent results as the RedBlackWhite teams dominated, winning 14 of their games, and losing just one. Overall our rugby boys played 28 games on the weekend, winning 26 and losing just 2.

A mild sunny day set the scene for the all important FNB-Classic Clash between the Maritzburg College and DHS 1st XVs. Unfortunately the game was riddled with handling and unforced errors, but a late comeback made the game very entertaining to watch.

The game started off with both teams trying to identify chinks in the armour of the opposition by throwing everything at each other. Eventually College drew first blood with a lovely counter attack from Khwezi Hadebe which was finished in familiar fashion by Philani Simamane. Henry Trodd added the extras and College led 7-0. DHS hit back with a searing break off the scrum from the DHS number 8 who popped it to his supporting scrumhalf, who dotted down for the first points of the match. The DHS kicker converted and the scores were tied.

Ill discipline close to their own line cost them dearly as Trodd dispatched another kick through the uprights for another 3 points. Scores were 10-7 in College's favour. Just before the end of the 1st half DHS camped in the College half and through some excellent slow ball management and a lapse in concentration from College in defense DHS managed to score in the corner. DHS knocked over a penalty before the break leaving the half time score at 15-10 in favour of DHS.

College managed to put the first points on the scoreboard in the second half by means of a rolling maul. Siya Ningiza was the player crossing the line at the back of the drive. Trodd once again converted and College led 17-15. College was penalized in a kickable position and the DHS kicker was successful again. Score 18-17 to DHS

College had strung together some phases and scored a beautiful team try with the ball travelling through the hands of Nzimande, Kekana, Hlophe and eventually Hadebe who was the man who finished nicely for College's 3rd try. Unfortunately Trodd's conversion didn't curl as he had wanted to and the score remained 22-18. College was penalized in kickable positions and DHS kicked another 2 penalties.

A turnover in the College 22 occurred with 10 minutes left and Nzimande managed to get the ball to Webster who then offloaded the ball to none other than Khwezi Hadebe. Hadebe sprinted a full 60 meters to put College ahead by 27 points to 24. With time up College once again had space out wide and Wandile Hlophe, the College lock, set off on a barnstorming run and passed it inside to his Captain Siphe Kekana who managed to get the ball away to Philani Simamane who aptly finished proceedings with a great team try in the opposite corner. Final score 34-24 to Maritzburg College.

College regains the Skonk Nicholson Cup which has spent the last two years at DHS. A welcome addition to the College trophy cabinet.
