Rugby

The weekend saw College play 20 rugby matches against Kearsney College with some excellent results as the RedBlackWhite teams dominated, winning 17 of their games, drawing one and losing just two. For our mighty 1st XV it was their first victory against Kearsney in 5 years!

1st team report – Cameron Fraser – 1st team Coach

Foggy, cold and wet conditions saw the Maritzburg College 1st XV make the trek up to Botha's Hill to play against Kearsney in their annual fixture. Stott field was muddy and wet underfoot and there was very low visibility whilst light rain was continuously falling on the Kearsney main field.

Kearsney managed to score the 1st try of the game with their very first foray into the Maritzburg College half. Kearsney couldn't convert their try which saw them leading 5 points to nil. College put themselves under lots of pressure by trying to play a wide expansive game which is more suited for dry weather.

In the 2nd half Kearsney dominated territory. After a turnover at scrum time, they managed to move the ball wide, and with some missed tackles, the Kearsney outside centre crashed over for Kearsney's 2nd try. The Kearsney goal kicker managed to convert and left the score at 12-0 to Kearsney.

College then stepped up their game and replied well with some brilliant tight play in the forwards, and Athi Matsheke scored College's 1st try. In the last 10 minutes College managed to maul very well off a line-out and after a couple of pick and drives, College crossed the try line to tie up the scores. The outcome of the game rested on the Maritzburg College scrumhalf Henry Trodd's shoulders. He once again did not disappoint and chased the ball through the poles to give the Maritzburg College 1st XV their 1st victory against Kearsney in 5 years.

Rainy, cool and misty conditions greeted those who braved the same on Saturday as College took Kearsney on in Hilcrest. Kearsney were charged for what would be a very rare win for them over College.

The first quarter started with Kearsney showing clear intentions with some good build up play and combinations. College however stood firm creating scoring chances of their own however neither unit could convert any opportunities. Early in the second quarter and Kearsney would turn the ball over and pounce on some scrappy midfield work from College. A great receive and turn at the top of College's circle would see a good strike hit the backboard. 1-0 Kearsney as the quarter would play out.

The second half started and College were clearly revved by some half time intervention and would play have their best patch of the match. The College outfit amassed 7 penalty corners only managing to convert once when following a Kearsney save a stroke was awarded. G Pio would slot the ball home levelling the tie at one apiece.
