Overview Sporting Achievements

Rugby

This weekend saw College field 18 rugby teams against Michaelhouse winning 17 of these – an excellent results for the #RedBlackWhite teams. Our 1st XV dominated in their game won 42-17. Overall College played 21 rugby matches on the day, and won 18, losing 3.

Match Report for 1st XV: Cameron Fraser (1st XV coach)

On Saturday 8 June, the Maritzburg College 1st XV took on Michaelhouse. After two narrow defeats in recent games the College outfit had a lot to prove.

College dominated territory at the start of the game and Athi Matsheke, the College tighthead, broke free from a ruck, whilst dragging a defender across the line, and managed to crash over for College's first score. Michaelhouse then camped in the College half and after several phases they managed to wear down the defence to score their first try.

Henry Trodd then slotted an easy penalty under the poles to put College ahead by 10 points. The mercurial Philani Simamane soon scored another brilliant try after the College forwards made all the hard yards in the midfield.

At the start of the 2nd half Philani Simamane managed to create something sublime once again with a set move off a ljneout which gave College a nice buffer of 25 points to 5. Wandile Hlophe the College number 4 charged down a kick from the Michaelhouse 10, managed to regather and offload to Siya Ningiza who crossed the line for another good College try. Michaelhouse hit back with another good try based on sucking in defenders and keeping the ball close to the origins.

College then managed to string many phases together and Wandile Hlophe once again broke through the defensive line and through some great interplay between Ningiza and Henrico Corbett the College team dotted down their 3rd try of the 2nd half.
