If your son is in a lower form, please encourage him to take the process seriously as he will have an opportunity to vote for the leaders of 2020.

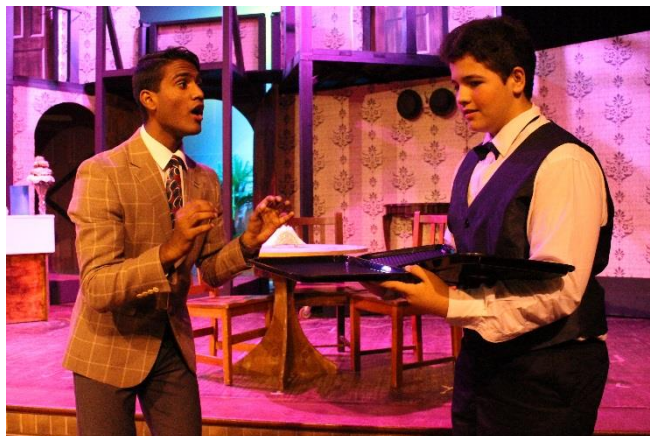
# OUR HOUSE
