

Cricket

College's cricket teams won an outstanding 14 of 15 matches played on the past weekend mostly against DHS.

The 1st XI lost the toss and were sent in to bat first. College were in a commanding position at the halfway stage, making 273 for 8 after the allotted 50 overs. Some excellent bowling saw College bowl DHS out for 143 and win by 130 runs.

On Friday this week, our 1st XI emerged as the champions of the Inland Quadrangular T20 competition, beating Hilton College by 7 wickets.

Basketball

The last weekend saw 9 teams in action against DHS, and 4 against Michaelhouse. College won an excellent 11 of their 13 games, and drew 1. For the 1st team encounter, both sides fielded their Stayers, but the game could be described as a lost opportunity as College failed to convert the shooting free throws giving away 19 potential points, and DHS won the game 47 – 35.

Waterpolo

Our waterpolo teams were in action against DHS and Hilton over the weekend with 6 matches being played.

College 1st team played DHS and were trailing 1-4 at the end of the first chukka. Despite a valiant late effort, College eventually lost 6-12.

Athletics

College's athletes had some outstanding performances at the Grey College Invitational meet over the weekend. N Mosebi was 1st in U15 100m in 11.1 seconds, and 1st in 200m with a time of 22.56, almost a full second faster than the U15 record set at school. J Kayemebe finished 1st in U14 100m electronic time of 11.2 seconds, and 1st in 200m with a time of 22.82, a full second faster than the 200m record he set at school. A Mbambo was 1st in U16 Long Jump in 6.6m, 2cm off the current school record.
