Housemaster's Address

Not only 2 College Old Boys, but two Hudson House Old Boys were playing. Dave Miller and Darryn Dupavillon. And interestingly enough, Dupavillon took his first International wicket in his first spell, and it was caught by Dave Miller. 2 Hudson House boys combining on one of the biggest stages.
