DID YOU KNOW...

- A modern school in every sense, Maritzburg College retains a strong sense of its **history and heritage**. Founded in 1863, this year, College is 159 years old. Our proud Old Boys Association celebrates its 125th anniversary this year
- The school unashamedly embraces and promotes its Core Values of **Commitment, Courage, Honesty, Respect, Integrity and Self-discipline**, which all our boys are expected to live out each day. Our College Credo includes an individual pledge for each boy to remain true to all that is College, its values, brotherhood and traditions.
- As the **largest and oldest all boys' school** in KwaZulu-Natal, we have 1300 boys of whom 485 are boarders residing in 5 boarding houses, supported by 50 live-in staff. Our staff to pupil ratio is 1:15.
- Having the boys fulfil their **academic potential** is our highest priority and we are committed to providing each boy with a well-rounded relevant and excellent education experience.

The Class of 2021 produced an outstanding set of Matric results:

- 100% pass rate and 89% Bachelor's Degree pass
 - 456 subject distinctions
 - 15 boys received seven distinctions and 10 boys received six distinctions
 - Seven boys placed on the top 10 in the district
- Our innovative **pastoral care programme**, managed through the 10 school day houses, aims to build a community within the school, creating supportive systems and positive relations and promoting a strong ethos of mutual care and concern. Through mentorship, we help each of our boys develop his sense of value and virtue-based character.
 - Maritzburg College is a **modern, relevant multi-racial** school that embraces all that is best in South Africa's ever-changing environment, and has a crucial role to play in nation building. Our Social Awareness Programme, involving pupil, staff and parents, is actively seeking ways to embrace and manage diversity in the school, and ensure this becomes embedded in the quality education we offer.
 - Our **sports facilities are world class**, catering for all the major sports – and a number of lesser ones too. Covering 25 hectares, the campus includes a High Performance Sports Centre, two indoor & two outdoor basketball courts, a world-class hockey AstroTurf, a full size heated water polo pool, seven tennis courts, four squash courts, seven sports fields, an indoor shooting range. In addition we have the Dusi River on our doorstep, and access to the AB Jackson astro, cycling velodrome, Maritzburg cricket oval, Harry Gwala soccer stadium and Msunduzi Athletics Track
 - Currently there are **318 College Old Boys** who have played sport at an international level, more than any other school in the country.
 - We have for many years excelled on the rugby field, and currently have more rugby teams than any other school in the country. Mr JM “Skonk” Nicholson was one of College's greatest catalysts for future rugby success; when he retired after 35 seasons as the coach of the First XV, 22 of his teams were unbeaten or lost only one match.
 - College's Red Army 1st XI have also dominated the school hockey rankings over the years. 2022 saw 6 College OCs represent their country at the African Cup of Nations. As defending champions, South Africa faced Egypt in the final which saw OC 2017 Brad Sherwood, playing in his first international tournament, secure the win for his country, and World Cup qualification.
 - Our 2022 Inter-House Athletics Championship, saw some long-standing records tumble with exceptional performances from the boys; Neo Mosebi, broke Peter Kyle's longstanding record (1974) of 10.60 secs in the U19 100m, with a time of 10.22 secs and is currently ranked 2nd in his age category in the world.

HISTORY OF RUGBY

Rugby has been played at Maritzburg College (popularly known as “College”) since October 1870, when the school (then the Pietermaritzburg High School) took on Hermannsburg in the old Market Square in the first recorded 15-a-side football match played in the Colony of Natal.

Although rugby enjoyed great prestige in the first few decades of the 20th Century, the appointment as First XV coach in 1948 of Mr JM “Skonk” Nicholson was the great catalyst for future success. Skonk’s effect was immediate: his 1948 side lost only to old rivals, Durban High School, and in the following year Skonk produced his first unbeaten team. He retired in 1982, after 35 seasons as the coach of the First XV. During that time, 22 of his teams were unbeaten or lost only one match.

A stand-out player in the early years was strapping farm boy, Philip Nel, who was the First XV captain and all-powerful head prefect of the school in 1921. Nel captained the side on the all-conquering tour of Australia and New Zealand in 1937. Such was the quality of the play of his imperious team that it was given the tongue-in-cheek accolade of being “the greatest team to leave New Zealand’s shores”. On the ship returning home, Nel formally announced his retirement from Springbok rugby by throwing his trusty old rugger boots into the sea. Like Alexander the Great, he had no more worlds to conquer.

Outstanding teams in the last five decades include the 1972 First XV, which supplied 10 Craven Week players and conceded only one try in 19 matches; the 1978 First XV, which won all of its matches; the record-breaking 1985 team, which won all of its 18 matches, including a 44-0 triumph over Bishops and a 10-4 win over a Grey College side brimming with five SA Schools caps; the 1987 side that included SA Schools’ captain Brenton Catterall and three other SA Schools’ players; and the 1988 First XV, which won all 15 of its fixtures.

Despite the retirement of the much-loved Mr Nicholson in 1982, that decade was a period of almost unbroken triumph for Maritzburg College rugby, and from 1981-1990 losses were suffered only against Glenwood (twice), Hilton and DHS (once each) among KZN schools.

This rugby success continued into the 1990s, with the 1994 team delivering an unbeaten season against all South African teams, losing only to Gisborne BHS in the final of the World Schools’ Tournament in Bowral, Australia. Another highlight of the decade was the unbeaten 1995 side, which enjoyed wins over Ermelo, Selborne, Grey High and Paul Roos Gymnasium, and big wins over Glenwood (61-13), Westville (62-6) and Kearsney (43-3). Skipped by Zane Aszalos, the 1995 XV contained two SA Schools’ captains – Pieter Dixon (1995) and Richard Kelly (1996).

By 2022, the explosion of professional rugby around the world meant that the number of Old Collegians playing the sport on the international stage had increased dramatically, and Maritzburg College alumni have in the last 30 years won caps for the Springboks (including Joel Stransky, Butch James, Peter Grant and Jesse Kriel), England, USA, Italy, Germany, Cyprus and Spain.

Maritzburg College First XV’s have continued to play with pride and old-fashioned guts, and all 28 of the school’s rugby teams play with fire, passion and some skill. Long may that continue.

For decades, the school's redoubtable Chief Induna, Zablun Kwelha, was a loyal supporter of the First XV. He travelled widely by bus with the Maritzburg College boys to watch them play, often taking bets on their success with his contemporaries at DHS and Glenwood. An unofficial adviser to his great friend, Mr Nicholson, he fervently held the view that each College First XV should contain at least one red-headed player - "For extra fire!"

RUGBY AT MARITZBURG COLLEGE

Founded in 1863, Maritzburg College played its first rugby match in 1870, against Hermannsburg. Playing on the old Market Square in the centre of town under Winchester Rules, College won by two goals to nil, in the first recorded rugby match played in the old Colony of Natal (let alone the whole of Africa – but that’s another story altogether).

Rugby quickly became the game of choice at College and, apart from a short period of time in the 1880s and 1890s, when soccer enjoyed a considerable following, has remained the most popular winter sport at College.

In the 1920s and 1930s College rugby took a downturn, in terms of both popularity and results. This was soon rectified after the Second World War, when, under the guidance of the legendary Skonk Nicholson (coach 1948-1982), College re-established itself as the premier rugby school in Natal.

Today the school fields up to 30 teams and participates in the foremost rugby festivals in the country.

Six overseas tours have been undertaken, most recently to the United Kingdom in 2019. Amongst the school’s 318 international sportsmen and officials at all codes, the following 16 Old Collegians have represented, or formally been selected for, South Africa at 15-man rugby:

- Ernest “Baby” Shum (1912), Walter Clarkson (1921-1924), Cecil “Bill” Payn (1924), Bertram “Beevee” Vanderplank (1924), Philip Nel (1928-1937) (captain), George van Reenen (1937), Keith Oxlee (1960-1965), Ormond Taylor (1962), Andy van der Watt (1969-1970), Joel Stransky (1993-1996), Jeremy Thomson (1996), Pieter Dixon (2000), Butch James (2001-2008), Peter Grant (2007), Craig Burden (2012), Jessie Kriel (2015-)

Philip Nel was the captain of the “Greatest Springboks” of 1937, who won the test series against the All Blacks in New Zealand. Joel Stransky kicked all the points in the Springboks’ 15-12 win over the same opponents in the Rugby World Cup Final at Ellis Park in 1995. Butch James (in 2007) and Jesse Kriel (in 2019) are also the holders of RWC gold medals.

A further eight Old Collegians have earned selection for international teams in the popular seven-man version of the game.

RUGBY VS ST CHARLES

Today, we welcome St Charles from across town to Goldstone's, to renew a rivalry that dates back to 1882. The clash between the two teams, on "Maritzburg Day" on Goldstone's, is a highly-anticipated one, with crowds of spectators being able to watch rugby at College for the first time since the end of the 2019 season. No doubt, a packed Basher Ridge will make for a stirring site!

The teams did not play against each other last year and in 2020, due to COVID, but they did play in 2018 and 2019, with College winning the former on Goldstone's (32-12) and the latter at Harwin Road (31-7). Maritzburg College and St Charles used to play an annual fixture until 1977, when the large difference in playing resources brought that traditional fixture to an end. History will show that College played St Charles for the first time in 1882 - making today's fixture College's third oldest one, after Hermansburg in 1870 and Hilton College in 1875.

This sporting exchange was treasured by many fans of schoolboy rugby in the Midlands, and the statistics show that there was often nothing to choose between the two schools, especially in the 1930s and 1940s. In fact, in 25 exchanges between 1935-1947, St Charles won 11 games and College seven, with seven games being drawn. During this time, it was not uncommon for the two schools to play each other on the double, both home and away.

St Charles' last victory over a College First XV was in 1951. St Charles has made great strides over the past 20 years, and it is a great pleasure for College to welcome them back to Goldstone's this afternoon.

The rivalry between the two schools across many sporting codes is intense, but a mutual respect exists.

HOCKEY AT **MARITZBURG COLLEGE**

Hockey has had official sport status at Maritzburg College since 1974. Since then, the game has grown in stature with College having had the honour of having been the first school in South Africa to lay an artificial surface on its premises and at the end of 2018 the AstroTurf was resurfaced.

Since 1951, College has had 35 Old Boys picked to play for South Africa and 1 for Canada, more international players than any school in the world, including 3 captains. M Guise-Brown, T Dlungwana, T Kok, T Paton, and S Nolutshungu and N Lembethe recently competed at in the 2021 Tokyo Olympic Games.

In 2022, B Sherwood became the 35th Old Boy to be picked for South Africa, making his debut at the most recent Africa Cup of Nations, scoring the winning shootout in the final against Egypt, to secure World Cup qualification.

The school has now produced 103 SA Schools Caps in its history with 94 of these having been earned since 1980. In 2019 (the last time a SA Schools side was selected) there were three 1st XI players who were selected for the SA Schools U18 team, namely, S Ngcongo, M Maphumulo and G Pio.

The first match between College and St Charles College was played in 1992 and today will only be the 16th time the two first teams have met. The summary of results between the two schools are as follows; 15 matches have been played, College have won 14 and one has ended in a draw.

The whole hockey community at Maritzburg College is excited to host our local rivals and we look forward to some exciting games on Pape's.
