We have a wonderful team of Housemasters and boarder masters, not to mention our San sisters, who go the extra mile to look after each boarder. It is important that we speak, and speak often, and if there is something your boy is struggling with, that we know so that we can help as best we can. The Boarding environment is not always easy, it is not always plain sailing. But the years a boy spends in the Boarding Establishment are meant to be fun and exciting, where he learns good lessons and makes strong friendships which will carry him through school, but more importantly through the rest of his life. Teenagers need us to make decisions, which sometimes they don't like or agree with, to protect them for their future.

One of the challenges we faced this year was looking over the traditions and privileges that the boys have grown accustomed to. We wanted to make sure that there is nothing going on in our school and its Boarding Establishment that is not honourable and edifying. The boys struggled to come to terms with this. As we engaged with them and discussed these things with them, it certainly brought the perspective to them and they started to see that we had theirs, and their school's, best interests at heart. Times have changed since their dads were at the school, and some ways of doings things need to be adjusted with time. But the core of what makes a College boy love his school and the virtues that ensure he is a gentleman and a young man of integrity, must continue long after we have left.

- Boarders Arrive Back: Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> of April, by 19:00.

- **Exams Begin**: 29<sup>th</sup> of May.
- Hosting Comrades Runners: Saturday 10 June. This is from 15:00 in the afternoon until early the next morning. We need as many boys as possible to leave the BE for this weekend. They have been granted a free optional.
- Term 2 ENDS: Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> of June.

All boys will receive two Optionals for term 2. For the weekends of the 9<sup>th</sup> of June and the 16<sup>th</sup> of June, the boys will receive free Optionals due to the exams.

We wish all the boys who are going on sports tours all the best. I am heading down to Grey High School in Gqeberha and then on to JHB for the St Stithians Festival with the 1<sup>st</sup> XI Hockey team.
