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Brief Overview of Maritzburg College

Maritzburg College is very proud of being the host of this year's U13 A & B Craven Week Tournament.






3. Map of Maritzburg College

By referencing the MAP and AERIAL VIEW of Maritzburg College please take note of the following important information.

REGISTRATION

• Registration will take place at the boarding establishment where each union stays. Unions who reside at Maritzburg College will register at the oval in front of the Victoria Hall (2).

PHOTOGRAPHS

• Photographs will be taken outdoors in front of Clark House (4) on Sunday, 25 June 2023. Please see schedule of photographs to be taken on Page 16.

DEVOTION SERVICE

• On Sunday, 25 June 2023 the Devotion Service will take place at the Alan Paton Hall (11) and learners and officials and supporters are to be seated by 16:15.





OFFICIAL FUNCTIONS

- The function for officials on Sunday, 25 June will take place at the Kent Pavilion (12) directly after the devotion service. The function on Monday, 26 June will take place at the Oliver Cultural Centre (10).
- The function on Thursday, 29 June will also take place at the Oliver Cultural Centre (10).

RUGBY FIELDS

- All U13 A Matches will take place on Goldstone's with the exception of Friday, 30 June where the U13 A Matches will be played on Goldstone's and Snow's.
- All U13 B Matches will take place on Snow's with the exception of Friday, 30 June where the U13 B Matches will be played on Snow's and Barns'.
- Barns' Field will be used as a practice field except for Friday, 30 June when matches will take place on it. There is still space next to Barn's rugby field for warming up of fields.
- St Charles will make practice fields available on their campus for associations who stay at their boarding establishment.

ENTRANCE ON MATCH DAYS

• There will be two entrances to the host venue. The main entrance (1) off College Road and a secondary pedestrian entrance by Goldstone's off Princess Margaret Drive.

PARKING

- Only the LOC, VIPs, SASRA officials and referees will be allowed to park inside the school premises. Parking will be made available for these officials on the terraces below Clark House (4).
- Busses are to park in Princess Margaret Drive.
- Parking for visitors and other officials will be available on Leach's, Lamond's, Nicholson's, Hill's and on Princess Margaret Drive.

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- Maritzburg College is situated within Pietermaritzburg, the capital city of KwaZulu-Natal. There are numerous guest houses, hotels and other accommodation nearby or within close proximity.
- ➤ The neighbouring towns of **Hilton** (14km from PMB), **Howick** (23km from PMB) and **Nottingham Road** (57km from PMB) offer a wide variety of unique country style accommodation should parents be interested.
- The closest airport to Maritzburg College is Pietermaritzburg Airport (4,2km away from the school). AirLink has regular flights from Pietermaritzburg Airport to Johannesburg. The closest major airport is uShaka International (102,6km from Maritzburg College) and serves all major routes in South Africa.

6. ACCREDITATION

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- Accreditation passes are the only form of identification for officials and those otherwise involved.
- Accreditation passes are issued to individuals in their team names.
- Accreditation passes must be worn at all times during all matches and official occasions.
- Accreditation passes are not transferrable.
- The organising committee (LOC) of the U13 Craven Week reserves the right to refuse any application for accreditation and withdraw any accreditation already issued.
- Accreditation passes remain the property of the LOC of the U13 Craven Week until after the tournament. Lost passes will be replaced at R50 per pass.

Each team is expected to bring 23 players, 2 coaches, 1 manager and 1 chaperone. The cost per participant is **R 3800,00** and includes accommodation, meals, a program and free entry. The manager and coaches will have 3 functions, which will include a meal and 3 free drinks.

- Early or late arrivals need to be brought to the attention of the LOC please.

7. REGISTRATION AND TEAM ENTRIES:

- Please complete the online Footprint registration of the Youth Weeks AS SOON AS POSSIBLE
- The following are the procedures to be followed regarding Registration of Players for this year's U13 Craven Week.
 - Team managers will be responsible to complete the player profile and upload/enter all supporting documentation of players. For teams outside South Africa, like Namibia and Zimbabwe, team managers are responsible to complete the player profile. Please upload a photograph and a copy of their passport, instead of ID, showing their names and date of birth.





- Team managers will also be required to register all team management members (all coaches, support staff and medical staff) on or before Thursday, 14 June 2023. It is the responsibility of the team manager to ensure that all management members complete their profiles and upload supporting documentation where required (including BokSmart numbers, First Aid Certificates, HPCSA number, Applicable World Rugby Concussion and First Aid in Rugby Certificate etc.).
- Only members who have submitted all of their required details will be issued with tournament accreditation.
- No team member will be allowed to register at the tournament.
- Players or management members that do not have an electronic participation ticket will not be allowed to take part in the tournament in any capacity.
- ➤ PLEASE NOTE: Footprint is a web-based system which requires the use of a computer and an internet connection to complete the above-mentioned tasks. Unions must please ensure all team managers have access to a computer and an Internet connection in order to complete the registration processes.
- > At registration, it is compulsory to hand in a file that contains copies of the following documents [SEE at the end of this manual], should it not be uploaded onto footprint prior to arrival:
 - A signed copy of every player's South African Rugby Union Participant Consent Form (SCHEDULE I)
 - A signed copy of every player's South African Rugby Union Member Profile Form (SCHEDULE II)
 - Doctor: Copy of their Health Professional Council Registration Number and copies of the World Rugby on-line Concussion Management for Doctors and Health Care Workers education certificate and World Rugby on-line First Aid In Rugby certificate and World Rugby on-line Match Day Medical Staff certificate.
 - O Physiotherapist: Copy of their Health Professional Council Registration Number and copy of their Active South African recognized First Aid certificate. Copies of the World Rugby online Concussion Management for Doctors and Health Care Workers education certificate and World Rugby on-line First Aid In Rugby certificate and World Rugby on-line Match Day Medical Staff certificate.
 - The World Rugby on-line educations modules are on the Player Welfare website: http://playerwelfare.worldrugby.org/

TEAM DECLARATION FORM

- Footprint system on or before 18:00 the day prior to the fixture.
- > Team Managers MUST confirm their submitted match-day 23 lists ONE HOUR prior to kick off of each fixture to accommodate for any late changes





TEAM ENTRIES

- Once Team Managers are registered and activated on Footprint, they will be assigned to their squads and be responsible to manage the registration process of all players and management members who will take part at the U13 Craven Week.
- ➤ These duties will include:
 - Names of Players, Coaches, Managers, Medical Doctor and/or Physiotherapist,
 Permanent Representative
 - Number of bus drivers, if any
 - Number and details of dietary requirements (e.g. Halaal, diabetic).

TEAM MEDICAL STAFF

- ➤ Team Medical Staff, who are either the Team Medical Doctor and/or Team Physiotherapist, must note the requirements to be met in order to be granted permission to roam the touch line during a match that their team participates in.
- These requirements are the following and will also be requested when they update their personal profiles on Footprint.
 - A team physiotherapist must have an active FIRST AID qualification from a South African training provider
 - All team medical staff must complete the following World Rugby On-Line education modules. The World Rugby on –line educations modules are on the Player Welfare website: http://playerwelfare.worldrugby.org/
 - Concussion Management for Doctors and Health Care Workers
 - First Aid In Rugby
 - Match Day Medical Staff
 - Copy of their Health Professional Council Registration number
 - As per World Rugby and SA Rugby Tournament Rules, only qualified medical doctors and physiotherapists can roam the touchline during a game that their team participates in.

MEDICAL FORMS

- Ensure that all players and their legal guardian thoroughly read and then sign the SOUTH AFRICAN RUGBY UNION PARTICIPANT CONSENT FORM.
- The signed SOUTH AFRICAN RUGBY UNION PARTICIPANT CONSENT FORM must then be loaded onto the player's profile on the Footprint system.
- Please note that no other version of this form will be accepted.





GENERAL

- ➤ Team Managers must note that the **U13 Craven Week** is a tournament for players not exceeding the age of **13**, in other words, under 13 years old on 1st January 2023. A player is regarded **13** as long as he does not turn **14** during the year **2023**. Players must be born in **2010 or after**.
- Players on a Medical Aid must complete in the relevant section in the SOUTH AFRICAN RUGBY UNION MEMBER PROFILE FORM (SECTION A) and ensure that this document is uploaded onto the player's profile on the Footprint system. Team Managers must also enter these details electronically onto the player's electronic profile on Footprint. An electronic copy (scanned copy) of the Medical Aid card must also be uploaded in this section or attached to the Player Consent form to be handed in during Tournament Registration.
- Every Team Manager will sign a written statement at registration in which he will declare his full understanding of the information on this website, pertaining to conditions of accommodation, as well as his full acceptance of the duties and responsibilities laid upon him.

All defaults and breakages must be documented and taken note of before they move in. When the team leaves the hostel at the end of the week, the same procedure will be followed before the team signs out. No team will be allowed to leave the hostel before such inspection has taken place and the necessary forms have been completed by both parties (Manager and Accommodation Representative).
- The hostel management and school do not accept any responsibility for loss, damage or injury resulting from the presence of the team in the hostel.
- No smoking or drinking is permitted in the hostel or within its boundaries.
- Occupants are responsible for the neatness and cleanliness of their room. Rooms will be cleaned by the hostel staff.

21. SASRA TOURNAMENT RULES – U13 CRAVEN WEEK

The following is a list of rules that will be in place the U13 Craven Week.

Target is 12:11 per team non-negotiable: Craven Week. The following is based on four games of rugby with a compulsory rest day after two games.

- 1. Primary school matches consist of two halves of 25 minutes each, running time. Only 5 min injury time per game is allowed. Coaches must ensure that their teams are ready to take the field for matches to start exactly on scheduled times.
- 2. SASRA, SARU, Tournament organizers and the Referee tournament manager will form a disciplinary committee for the duration of the tournament. Managers must accompany players to hearings. Players who are found guilty of using vulgar language, display unacceptable behaviour or racism, will not be allowed to participate for the rest of the tournament
- 3. Each team must have a full front row on the bench as according to IRB law variation 3.5 (c).





- 4. Each one of the 23 players in a squad must have played no less than **3** full halves by the end of the third game unless declared injured by the tournament doctor. A full half means the player must start and complete a half. If this was not possible SASRA officials must be informed and resolve the issue.
- 5. Only the Tournament Doctor may declare a player unfit to play.
 - 5.1. If a player is deemed unfit to continue to play in the tournament, he may be replaced with the endorsement of SASRA, keeping targets in place.
 - 5.2. If a player is barred from the tournament, he may be replaced with the endorsement of SASRA, keeping targets in place.
 - 5.3. If there is a need to make a temporary blood replacement the player must be replaced by a player who can play in the position in accordance with BokSmart regulations.
 - 5.4. If there is a need to make a temporary replacement due to an injury the player must be replaced by a player who can play in the position in accordance with BokSmart regulations
 - 5.5. If there is a need to make a permanent replacement due to an injury the player must be replaced by a player who can play in the position in accordance with BokSmart regulations.
- 6. Yellow cards: 5 minutes playing time. Red cards: Player's red carded must be available 30 minutes after the conclusion of the match for the hearing.
- 7. BokSmart: All officials must always to be in a possession of the required BokSmart accreditation. This will need to be recorded on the team lists for the day.

CITING PROCEDURES AT THE U13 CRAVEN WEEK

- 1. Regulations 17 of the IRB and the SARU Illegal and Foul Play and Misconduct Regulations will apply mutatis mutandis (with the necessary changes).
- 2. SASRA and the U13 Craven Week LOC will appoint a committee to deal with discipline issues that may arise.
- 3. Team Manager may refer incidents of foul play in writing and on the prescribed form to the appointed SARU Citing Commissioner within 4 (four) hours after the match.
- 4. The Team Manager referring the incident shall provide the best evidence to enable the Citing Commissioner to consider the referral
