A MESSAGE FROM THE HEADMASTER OF MARITZBURG COLLEGE

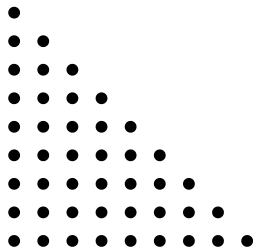

Maritzburg College would like to extend a very warm welcome to all the players, parents, officials, and hockey enthusiasts from around the country to the annual Nomad's festival.

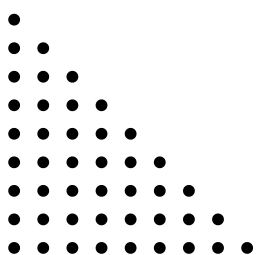

HOCKEY AT MARITZBURG COLLEGE

Hockey has only had official sport status at Maritzburg College since 1974. Since then, the game has grown in stature, with College hockey being relocated from the lush green fields of Barns' to having had the honour of being the first school in South Africa to lay an artificial surface on its premises. The new home for the 'Red Army' was to be named after the fifth Maritzburg College Headmaster, Mr Septimus Pape (1926-1937). The facility saw timely resurfacing at the end of 2018. The most recent inclusion to the Pape's complex brings forth the opportunity for College hockey to be enjoyed under lights, with the first official home fixture for the 2024 season being played against Clifton on a Friday night. The completion of this project endeavours to add great value to the hockey fraternity for generations to come.

Since 1951, College has had 36 Old Boys picked to play for South Africa and one for Canada, more international players than any school in the world, including three captains. M Guise-Brown, T Dlungwana, T Kok, T Paton, and S Nolutshungu and N Lembethe recently competed at in the 2021 Tokyo Olympic Games. B. Sherwood, made his debut in 2022 at the most recent Africa Cup of Nations, scoring the winning shootout in the final against Egypt, to secure World Cup qualification.

In 2024, A Walstroom, became the 36th Old Boy to be picked for South Africa. He will be making his debut at the 13th African Games in Accra, Ghana. This national call up follows both his and J. Campbell (OC 2018) inclusion in the SA squad at the 2024 Hockey 5's World cup recently held in Oman, Egypt.

The school has now produced 103 SA Schools Caps in its history with 91 of these having been earned since 1980. Last year, one first XI player, N. Holmes was selected for the SA Schools U17 High Performance training squad who participated at the Dito Mirnawan Cup in Kuala Lumpur in Malaysia. Four boys namely D. Jackson, C. Jenkins, S. Sithembu and B. Thorton-Dibb were selected for the SA U16 High Performance Camp. 2023 saw 35 players being included in KZN inland teams at the U14, U16 and U18 level. This comprises 40% of provincial selections for Maritzburg College Hockey. These annual representations positively contribute to and strengthen the consistency of Maritzburg College hockey culture.

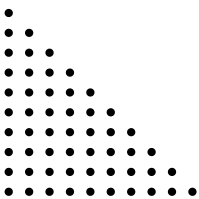

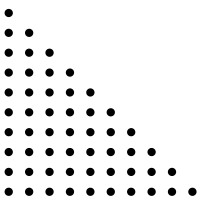

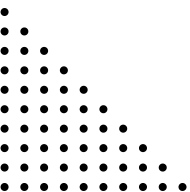

SPONSORS





Maritzburg College has an automated lightning siren which is linked to a satellite system and is self-activated when the lightning in our area is active. There are two types of alerts; the first is a long sounding siren which means take cover immediately, the second is a series of short blasts which means that the lightning is clear and it is safe to go out. We take the safety of our boys, staff, parents, and community seriously, and ask that the following must be adhered to should the siren go off:

What to do when the warning siren sounds

- Immediately proceed to take cover and shelter (not under a tree).
- All sport / outdoor activities must stop immediately.
- SHELTER AREAS:
 - Barns' / Pape's / Goldstone's / Snow's = High Performance Centre / Kent Pavilion
 - Lamond's / Nicholson's / Leach's = HPC
 - Swimming Pool / Tennis Courts = BE / Howies Hut/.OCC
 - AB Jackson Fields = Astro stadium / BE / Soccer Office
 - Camps Drift = Canoe Club
- Remain in the shelter areas until you hear the ALL CLEAR siren.

What must NOT HAPPEN when the siren sounds

- Boys must not continue practicing or playing.
- No duck-diving or any playing on fields whatsoever.
- No walking around.
- Do not stand under a tree.
- Stay away from pools/ puddles of water.
- Stay out of open spaces (fields/car parks).

Where are the sirens / warning lights

- On the roof of HPC and on the roof of Nathan House in the Boarding Establishment.

WARNING SIRENS / LIGHTS PROCEDURES

- Lightning warning and evacuate
- LED Light on tower above the HPC and Nathan House will start flashing.
- If you see the light flashing - it is not safe to be out.
- The ALL CLEAR siren will be a series of short bursts and the lights will be switched off.

During storms / heavy weather - please make a habit of checking the warning light to see if you may have missed a siren. If the light is off - it is safe to be on the fields.
