RUGBY VS MICHAELHOUSE

It's a great pleasure today to host our noble visitors from Balgowan, Michaelhouse, on this, the most stirring day on Maritzburg College's calendar. After two COVID-depleted seasons (2020-2021) and some unusual fixturing outcomes, it has been five years since College and Michaelhouse last met on Goldstone's – a 42-17 win by the home team.

College and Michaelhouse first met on the rugby field in 1901, although the result of that match has proved elusive to find.

For many years, around the time of the Anglo-Boer War (1899-1902), Michaelhouse, Hilton and, later, Durban High School were College's only school opponents. The remainder of College's fixtures were against clubs and military regiments. Only from the 1930s did other schools start to regularly appear on our fixture list, and the Michaelhouse fixture was then, and remains, an important date on our sporting calendar.

For nearly 70 years College and Michaelhouse met on a home and away basis every year, until 1971, when the growing number of schools made it difficult to maintain this arrangement. Since then, one match a year has become the norm.

A fierce tussle is anticipated on Goldstone's this afternoon, between two well-drilled, motivated teams.



HOCKEY AT MARITZBURG COLLEGE

Hockey has only had official sport status at Maritzburg College since 1974. Since then, the game has grown in stature, with College hockey being relocated from the luscious greens of Barns' to having had the honour of being the first school in South Africa to lay an artificial surface on its premises. The new home for the 'Red Army' was to be named after the fifth Maritzburg College Headmaster, Mr Septimus Pape (1926-1937). The facility saw timely resurfacing at the end of 2018. The most recent inclusion to the Pape's complex brings about the opportunity for College hockey to be enjoyed under lights, with the first official home fixture for the 2024 season being played against Clifton on a Friday night. The completion of this project endeavours to add great value to the hockey fraternity for generations to come.

Since 1951, College has had 36 Old Boys picked to play for South Africa and one for Canada, more international players than any school in the world, including three captains. M Guise-Brown, T Dlungwana, T Kok, T Paton, and S Nolutshungu and N Lembethe competed at in the 2021 Tokyo Olympic Games. B Sherwood, made his debut in 2022 at the most recent Africa Cup of Nations, scoring the winning shootout in the final against Egypt, to secure World Cup qualification.

In 2024, A Walstroom, became the 36th Old Collegian to be picked for South Africa. He will be making his debut at the 13th African Games in Accra, Ghana. This national call up follows both his and J Campbell(OC 2018) inclusion in the SA squad at the 2024 Hockey 5's World Cup recently held in Oman, Egypt.

The school has now produced 103 SA Schools caps in its history with 91 of these having been earned since 1980. Last year, one first XI player, N Holmes was selected for the SA Schools U17 high performance training squad, participated at the Dito Mirnawan Cup in Kuala Lumpur in Malaysia. Four boys, namely D Jackson, C Jenkins, S Sithembu and B Thornton-Dibb, were selected for the SA U16 high performance camp. 2023 saw 35 players being included in KZN Inland teams at the U14, U16 and U18 levels. This comprises 40% of provincial selections for Maritzburg College hockey. These annual representations positively contribute to and strengthen the consistency of Maritzburg College's hockey culture.

HOCKEY VS MICHAELHOUSE

Michaelhouse is one of College's oldest rivals. The first match played between the two teams was in 1974. The summary of results between the two schools is as follows: 77 matches have been played, College winning 44, Michaelhouse winning 17, and 16 ending in a draw.

We are looking forward to welcoming Michaelhouse to College and onto Pape's on Reunion Day.

Trivia: Maritzburg College and Michaelhouse

- When Maritzburg College and Michaelhouse met on the rugby field for the first time in 1901, during the Anglo-Boer War, the College team was captained by Frank Burchell "Binkie", later a distinguished professor of law at the University of Natal. Both his sons followed in his footsteps as law professors and deans of faculty but they were educated at Michaelhouse!
- The score from that inaugural match is lost in the mists of time. However the scores from the next four are not but they all were Michaelhouse victories!
- College's first recorded victory came in 1904, when the First XV captained by E Le M Trafford prevailed 6-0 in the teams' second match of the season. Trafford remains the only College boy to have attained the 'royal flush' of head prefect, dux, captain of the First XI and captain of the First XI.
- (Of his three brothers who all played for the First XV two were killed in the First World War: Capt GT Trafford (Life Guards) in action in Northern France and Lt ET Trafford (Norfolk Regiment) of illness in India.)
- College won its first 'double' of home and away wins over Michaelhouse the following year.
- From 1908, when College was captained by future Rhodes Scholar "Rosey" Watt (who was another tragic World War I casualty) and the teams' first of three clashes in 1921, College won 19 successive matches against Michaelhouse.
- Thereafter, College rugby went through a rather lean inter-War patch, winning only eight of the next 30 fixtures against 'House (1921-1938), who prevailed on 20 occasions.
- The lone stand-out season during this time was 1932, with "Jacko" Todd's unbeaten XV wracking up wins of 17-3 and 17-0.
- However, the appointment as College's First XV coach of Mr JM "Skonk" Nicholson in 1948 soon saw a turn-around in the fortunes of its rugby, which continued into the 20th Century. From 1948 to 2007, 78 matches were played (often two per season), with Michaelhouse enjoying wins in 1950, 1953, 1965, 1980, 1991 and 1999.
- The resurgence in Michaelhouse rugby from 2008 onwards saw them with four out of the next five matches, and they enjoyed further wins over College in 2015 and in 2022-2023.
- College's biggest wins over Michaelhouse were both in 1915 wins of 43-0 and 41-0.
- Michaelhouse's biggest win was a 34-0 drubbing in 1928 a record loss by a College XV that stood for nearly 70 years!
- A review of the past 14 fixtures indicate that there is very little to choose between the two sides, who share the spoils at seven wins each.
- With its large number of teams, Michaelhouse these days offers College the most number of rugby fixtures of any school in KZN – much to the gratitude of Mr Kyle and the College fixtures office!

Maritzburg College Archives

MARITZBURG COLLEGE'S RUGBY AND SPORT

Founded in 1863, Maritzburg College (known locally as "College") is the oldest boys' high school in KZN. It played its first rugby match in 1870, winning by two goals to nil against Hermannsburg on the Market Square in town, in the first recorded rugby match played in the old Colony of Natal. The College team was captained by George Macfarlane.

In 1870, George Macfarlane captained the College team to victory over Hermannsburg. By 1900, he was Col. GJ Macfarlane CMG, a past commanding officer of the Natal Carbineers and the mayor of Pietermaritzburg. In the photo on the left, Col. Macfarlane accompanies Field Marshal Lord Roberts, while the latter pays a visit to the colonial capital during the Boer War.



From 1948 until 1982, the College First XV enjoyed the coaching services of the much-loved Mr JM "Skonk" Nicholson. In Skonk's 35 seasons in charge of the First XV, 22 of his teams were unbeaten or lost only one match.

His stress unusually evident, Skonk Nicholson walks towards the field immediately before the return home match versus a strong Glenwood side in 1979, alongside his skipper, Craig Jamieson. The College XV turned around a record 6-33 loss in Durban into a 7-3 win on its beloved Goldstone's.





Amongst College's 329 international sportsman/officials, Philip Nel captained the "Greatest Springboks" to New Zealand in 1937, Kevin Pietersen (England) and David "Killer" Miller are bludgeoning batsmen of renown, and former Springbok lock, Cecil "Bill" Payn, earned fame as "the Man who ran the Comrades Marathon in his rugby boots"!

Popular rugby referee, Bryn Emms, recently earned selection for the 2024 SA touch rugby team. When he earns his first cap, Bryn will become international #330.

Jesse Kriel won his second RWC gold medal with the 2023 Springboks, and has thus far earned 68 Test caps and scored 15 tries for the Boks.

In 2024, up to 30 rugby teams will don the school's proud Red-Black-White hoops.

Some Trivia about these players:

• The remarkably talented and versatile **Bill Payn** played sport for Natal in five disciplines, and also earned a Military Medal for gallantry in the Western Desert in World War II.

- While a prisoner-of-war in Poland during the war, Bill coached burly prop, Okey Geffin, at goal-kicking. Geffin booted the Boks to a 4-0 series win over the touring 1949
 All Blacks.
- When he died in 1990, aged 96, "Beevee" Vanderplank was the oldest Springbok.
- After leading the Boks to victory over the 1937 All Blacks, Phil Nel tossed his boots into the sea on the way home - "he had no more worlds to conquer".

- In World War II, SA soldiers would often chaff their Kiwi compadres with the question, "What was the greatest team to leave New Zealand's shores"? The cheeky answer was, "The 1937 Springboks, of course!"
- In the old amateur days, Andy van der Watt was invariably referred to as the "Fastest Springbok Ever". His school record for the 100 yards was 9.9s.

- Andy played for the Natal Schools' teams for four seasons, 1962-1965 a record eventually equalled by Clint Bruyns.
- Joel Stransky kicked all the points in the Boks' 15-12 win over the All Blacks in the 1995 RWC Final.
- A late-bloomer, **Jem Thomson** started off in College's U14F rugby team.
- **Pieter Dixon** is named after his grandfather, PGV van der Bijl, a former SA cricketer who became a revered headmaster of Bishops Prep. His uncle is the popular ex-fast-bowler, "Big Vince" who taught at College in the 1970s.
- **Butch James'** dad played football for SA, and his brother golf. An able wicketkeeper /batsman, Butch was in the same College First XI as "KP" Pietersen.

• A multitalented Rhodes Scholar, **Hubert "Trilby" Freakes** was killed in a 'plane crash in World War II while serving in the Royal Air Force. He captained Oxford University in the 1938 Varsity Match versus Cambridge.

- At the 1999 RWC, only one try was scored against the cup-winning Wallabies team - by Juan Grobler (USA)!
- Members of **Chad Erskine's** family have attended Maritzburg College since the 1870s, and Private Robert Erskine was College's first of 264 alumni killed in battle in the Drakensberg in 1873. Stephen (OC 1965), Andrew (OC 1967) and Stuart ("Sugar") (OC 1992) all captained SA at polo. The latest Erskine is currently in 4th Form.
- In his youth, Wim Visser was regarded as a basketball prodigy. He was SA Schools' captain in 1987, and
 followed that up with a successful one-year stint in 1988 at Michaelhouse, earning selection that year for the
 Natal Schools' rugby team.
- Brenton Catterall's father, Peter (1961), and Andrew Norton's father, Moray (1975), both captained the Natal Schools' Crayen Week teams as Brenton himself did too.
- At 6'5" and 130 kg, Warren Ansell claims the proud title of being the biggest capped scrumhalf in test history!


