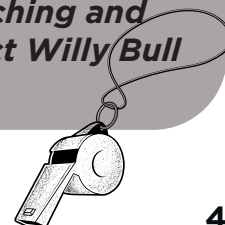

RUGBY VS GLENWOOD

Today, we welcome Glenwood High School from Durban to Goldstone's, to continue a rivalry that dates back to 1921, making Glenwood one of our oldest and most respected rivals. Indeed, the total number of matches played by the First XV's since 1921 is second only to College's rivalry with Durban High School (194 matches).

Today also marks the end of the 2024 winter sports programme - a milestone that is often tinged with an unusual melancholy, as players and supporters ponder the rather empty and lacklustre Saturdays to come! We thank the College skipper, P Kubheka, and his team for the entertainment they have given us since March and the pride and old-fashioned "mSatana" (to use the description so loved by Mr JM Nicholson) they showed every weekend. I am sure that the Glenwood supporters will feel the same towards their own XV from the "Green Machine".

Over many decades, the First XV's from College and Glenwood earned a healthy respect for one-another, with Glenwood often fielding big, physical packs against successive College teams in especially the 1970s and 1980s. Matches in those long-lost days made for strategic tussles between the every-wily Mr "Skonk" Nicholson from College and the "young Turk" from Glenwood, Mr "Topsy" Hortop. We wish Mr Hortop a swift recovery, as he battles with his current illness, and hope that he will soon be back in the classroom, teaching his beloved DH Lawrence!

One thinks of the epic clash between the fine Derek La Marque-inspired 1979 Glenwood side and the College team of that year captained by Craig Jamieson - which managed to turn a 6-33 drubbing vs Glenwood in only the 2nd match of the season into a 7-3 win on Goldstone's; or, more recently, the 40-44 win by Glenwood on Reunion Day in 2013, when a 14-man College side fought bravely to the final whistle against polished opponents, in one of the most exciting matches ever played on Goldstone's (photos).

A derby Saturday fixture played in wintry sunshine on Goldstone's against Glenwood makes for a particularly eagerly-awaited prospect - and we are delighted to welcome our old friends and rivals back to our school today.

RUGBY VS GLENWOOD CONTINUED

Over many years, College had the better of the First XV exchanges, and this is reflected in the overall statistics below. However, it's important to bear in mind, too, that 2021's 20-12 win by the College First XV in Durban put an end to 11 consecutive wins over the Red-Black-White by the Durban side. Since the start of the 2007 season, College has won only four of the 28 matches played – with two draws in 2012 and the teams sharing the spoils at one win each in 2023. Earlier this year, Kubheka's charges worked hard for their 18-7 win in Durban.

Today, in the 178th clash between the two teams, we look forward to another hard-fought contest between these two proud rugby schools.

HOCKEY AT MARITZBURG COLLEGE

Hockey has only had official sport status at Maritzburg College since 1974. Since then, the game has grown in stature, with College hockey being relocated from the lush greens of Barns' to having had the honour of being the first school in South Africa to lay an artificial surface on its premises.

The new home for the 'Red Army' was to be named after the fifth Maritzburg College Headmaster, Mr Septimus Pape (1926-1937). The facility saw timely resurfacing at the end of 2018. The most recent inclusion to the Pape's complex brings about the opportunity for College hockey to be enjoyed under lights, with the first official home fixture for the 2024 season being played against Clifton on a Friday night. The completion of this project endeavours to add great value to the hockey fraternity for generations to come.

Since 1951, College has had 36 Old Boys picked to play for South Africa and one for Canada, more international players than any school in the world, including three captains. M Guise-Brown, T Dlungwana, T Kok, T Paton, S Nolutshungu and N Lembethe competed at the 2021 Tokyo Olympic Games.

The school has now produced 103 SA Schools caps in its history with 91 of these having been earned since 1980. Last year, one first XI player, N Holmes was selected for the SA Schools U17 high performance training squad. Old Boys, A Walstroom and J Campbell enjoyed an exciting opportunity last year when they travelled to Egypt and represented the SA Hockey 5's team at the World Cup.

Maritzburg College is extremely proud of the five hockey Old Boys representing South Africa at the current Paris Olympics. They are Brad Sherwood, Tevin Kok, Matthew Guise-Brown, Peabo Lembethe and Devon van Der Merwe.

HOCKEY VS GLENWOOD

Glenwood is one of College's oldest rivals and the first match played between the two teams was in 1975. The summary of results between the two schools are as follows: 63 matches have been played, College have won 54, Glenwood have won 8 and 3 have ended in a draw. College won the first fixture between the two schools earlier this year 5-0.

We are looking forward to welcoming Glenwood to Pape's for the final fixture of the 2024 season.

MARITZBURG COLLEGE'S RUGBY AND SPORT

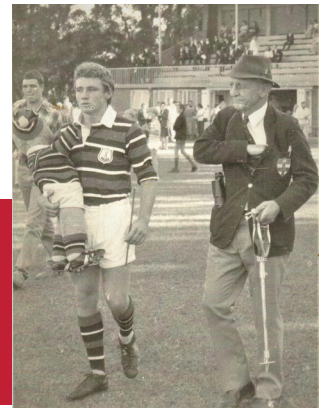
Founded in 1863, Maritzburg College (known locally as “College”) is the oldest boys’ high school in KZN. It played its first rugby match in 1870, winning by two goals to nil against Hermannsburg on the Market Square in town, in the first recorded rugby match played in the old Colony of Natal. The College team was captained by George Macfarlane.

In 1870, George Macfarlane captained the College team to victory over Hermannsburg. By 1900, he was Col. GJ Macfarlane CMG, a past commanding officer of the Natal Carbineers and the mayor of Pietermaritzburg. In the photo on the right, Col. Macfarlane accompanies Field Marshal Lord Roberts, while the latter pays a visit to the colonial capital during the Boer War.



From 1944 until 1982, the school enjoyed the coaching services of the much-loved Mr JM “Skonk” Nicholson. In Skonk’s 35 seasons in charge of the First XV, 22 of his teams were unbeaten or lost only one match.

His stress unusually evident, Skonk Nicholson walks towards the field immediately before the return home match versus a strong Glenwood side in 1979, alongside his skipper, Craig Jamieson. The College XV turned around a record 6-33 loss in Durban into a 7-3 win on its beloved Goldstone's.



Amongst College’s 334 international sportsman/officials, Philip Nel captained the “Greatest Springboks” to New Zealand in 1937, Kevin Pietersen (England) and David “Killer” Miller are bludgeoning batsmen of renown, and former Springbok lock, Cecil “Bill” Payn, earned fame as “the Man who ran the Comrades Marathon in his rugby boots”!

“KP” reminisces about his playing days for the 3rd XV at College with Naseer Hussein, during a recent visit to his Alma Mater.

Popular rugby referee, Bryn Emms, recently earned selection for the 2024 SA touch rugby team.

Jesse Kriel won his second RWC gold medal with the 2023 Springboks, and has thus far earned 71 Test caps and scored 16 tries for the Boks.

In 2024, up to 30 rugby teams donned the school’s proud Red-Black-White hoops.

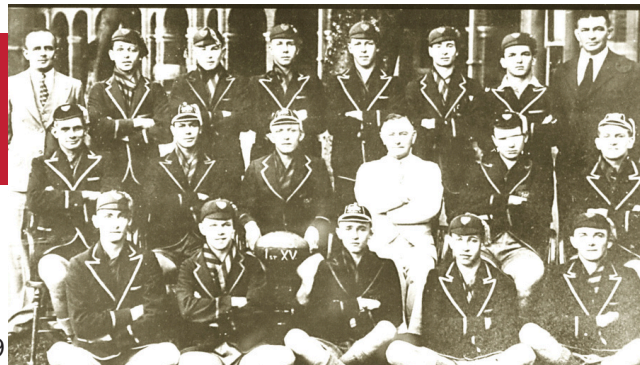

Current Sharks players from Maritzburg College include prop Ntuthuko Mchunu, hooker Fez Mbatha and lock Jeandre Labuschangne.

Some Trivia about these players:

- The remarkably talented and versatile **Bill Payn** played sport for Natal in five disciplines, and also earned a Military Medal for gallantry in the Western Desert in World War II.

Bill Payn (back right) poses as the coach of the Durban High School First XV in 1935. The captain of the DHS team is the head prefect of "School" – Bill's cousin, none other than James Mervyn "Skonk" Nicholson.



- While a prisoner-of-war in Poland during the war, Bill coached burly prop, Okey Geffin, at goal-kicking. Geffin booted the Boks to a 4-0 series win over the touring 1949 All Blacks.
- When he died in 1990, aged 96, "**Beevee**" Vanderplank was the oldest Springbok.
- After leading the Boks to victory over the 1937 All Blacks, **Phil Nel** tossed his boots into the sea on the way home – "he had no more worlds to conquer".

Tackle safety law changes for school and club rugby

- Tackles in open play must be made at the base of the sternum (breastbone) or below.
- Double tackles (as per Law) are permitted in open play but must be made at the base of the sternum or below.
- The tackle height law does not apply to the tackle assist on condition no head & neck contact is made.
- The ball carrier in open play may carry the ball into contact in a forward bent body position, but must have head and shoulders above the hips, and must make the 'safe zone' between the sternum and mid-thigh, accessible to the tackler.
- The ball carrier in open play may not carry the ball headfirst into contact with the body fully bent and horizontal, or with head lower than the hips.
- The ball carrier may 'pick-and-drive' or "pick and go" with their head & shoulders lower than their hips (lower risk of danger).
- The ball carrier at the 'pick-and-drive' may not place a hand on the ground before contact to propel themselves forward into contact (the technique known locally as the 'cannon-arm').
- A player may only bind (latch) onto the 'pick-and-drive' ball carrier once they have already made contact with the defender.
- A ball carrier may have their head & shoulders below their hips when they are in a realistic position/opportunity to score a try.

50/22 Law applicable to all school and club rugby

- If an attacking team kicks the ball from anywhere in their own half and it bounces inside the opposition's 22 before then bouncing into touch, the kicking team gets the throw at the resultant lineout.
- If the ball is "taken back" into the attacking team's half, they cannot be awarded the resultant lineout in the 50/22 law unless a phase of play takes place (maul/tackle or ruck) and after which the kick is made.
